

Rare Wildlife Expedition - July 2021

Two guests booked a three-nights expedition to see Bennett's Tree-kangaroo and Godman's Rock-wallaby. These guests had not been out with me before. A male **Bennett's Tree-kangaroo** was found the first night. Good views were had as the animal basically sat still in full view for the time that we spent with it. I had chosen not to take my flash which was a mistake.



Having had the Bennett's Tree-kangaroo the first night we spent the second night looking for Godman's Rock-wallaby. We missed out, but we had a nice encounter with Northern Quoll. Driving back to our accommodation, we had 3 Brown-headed Snake.

The third night we had our other main target: **Godman's Rock-wallaby**. It was seen at dusk. Earlier that day I showed my guests one of two ssp. of the Tropical Scrubwren (*ssp. dubius*). Not easy and not enough time to get photos of this one. Guests concluded they were happy to get away with good views.
